

Parent forum (Relationships, Health & Sex Education) 11 May 2021.

Questions and answers:

Q: How will this be taught in the Woodland Centre? My child is starting to ask a few questions.

A: We will meet with Woodland staff to discuss the best approach and make sure they use the right content for the age and development of the child so the children understand it emotionally.

Q: Will we get any content on Seesaw to see when they learning, like on Cornerstones topics, so as parents we are educated a little so we can talk to them without getting embarrassed?

A: We will send out a simple overview of what is taught for each area so that parents know what they can discuss and follow up.

Q: I am already getting questions back from my y4 child and am getting a bit worried with how much I should be telling my daughter. I think a lot of them are talking already in the playground.

A: The overview mentioned above should help with this.

Q: Is there any content in the curriculum that links up with the online safety curriculum? Some children when they hear new words/ideas in lessons or the classroom or the playground will inevitably look to online sources.

A: We teach online safety as part of PSHE and the Computing curriculum. We can cover the types of things we should/should not look up online. It will be useful to do a reminder about security settings on home devices too for parents.
